

CUDDLY CHEVRON

BABY
BLANKET

Simple, classic, and warm, the Cuddly Chevron Baby Blanket is easy to make and a great gift for any baby.

Sizes

30" x 30" after washing

Gauge

5 sts and 9 rows = 1" after washing

Materials & Notions

Cascade Yarns Avalon - 2 skeins of each color

C1: 10 - Artisan's Gold (350 yds)

C2: 02 - Silver (350 yds)

C3: 17 - Enamel Blue (350 yds)

US 7 (4.5mm) 36" Circular Needle

Tapestry Needle

Stitch Markers (Optional)

Abbreviations

k = knit

p = purl

k2tog = knit 2 stitches together

ssk = slip 1st st as if to knit, slip 2nd st as if to purl; insert the left needle into the front of the sts and knit together

reverse YO = yarn over by wrapping the yarn over the top of the needle from the back to the front

LLinc = insert left needle into the left leg of the stitch 2 stitches below last worked stitch and put it on the right needle; knit into the back leg

LRinc = insert right needle into the right leg of the stitch below the next stitch and put it on the left needle; knit

C1 (2,3) = Color 1 (2,3)

st(s) = stitch(es)

Notes

- If you want to make your blanket smaller or larger, the stitch repeat is 16 sts + 1.
- While knitting this blanket, I placed a marker after the first increase and decrease in every repeat. It helped me keep track of where I was in the row and saved me from ripping out several times.

Pattern

With C1, cast on 161 sts using the long-tail cast on.

Row 1: *k1, k2tog, k5, LLinc, k1, LRinc, k5, ssk*, repeat between * * until 1 sts remains, k1

Row 2: knit all

Repeat **Rows 1** and **2** 5 times. (10 rows worked total). Cut C1, switch to C2 and work 10 rows. Cut C2, switch to C3 and work 10 rows.

Work 8 stripes of each color. On the last stripe, stop after working the 9th row. Bind off on the wrong side as follows:

Reverse YO, k1, pull YO over knit st, *Reverse YO, k1, pull both the YO and rightmost k st over the left k st at the same time.* Repeat between * * to end of row. Cut yarn and weave in ends.

If you've used the recommended yarn, Cascade Avalon, finish the blanket by putting it through the washer and dryer. Seriously. When it comes out, the blanket will be softer and cushier than before.
